## Record numbers last financial year. Return to growth above and beyond what FY 24 was for 26 and Geoff Duggan Launceston Airport beyond. Passenger numbers are strong. Update Currently in the middle of a three-year strategy period. Three-year corporate strategy periods, several key deliverables over the last 6 to 9 months. Steve and his team are working closely with the State Government with the Aviation Attraction Fund. Plan to deliver a \$16m capital spend across this financial year with similar spend, if not more ,in the next two financial years. Significant work being done within the Common User Departure Lounge and the amenities, as we continue planning around the arrivals hall expansion and then two significant projects within the precinct. Major upgrades across our IT systems, particularly around cyber, but also improving the Wi-Fi experience for customers which will come online over the next three months. Continue to work with Northern Midlands Council through the Northern Tasmania Development Corporation and their appointed project manager around what a logistics precinct might look like within this area, whether it be within the airport precinct or across the road. Shane, CEO Launceston Airport will be leaving in mid-September as he has taken up a role as CEO at Queenstown Airport, New Zealand. Shane has done a fantastic job at this airport. Key projects to touch on as we're entering a phase of delivery this calendar year. Ilya Brucksch Property & Development The departure hall is a combination of a number of projects including: The Launceston Store Update upgrade, the Wilderness Café to Liv Eat, Hudsons to Kanamaluka and Boags Bar to Gatty's Bar. Upgrading seating to accommodate families, groups and those travelling individually. Additionally adding charging stations, carpeted areas and the old screening point will be fitted out creating a quieter zone. All amenities will be completely rebuilt. Outside the terminal there are a number of projects including: Tas Fire Development which is close to sign the agreement for lease which will then trigger a design phase for that building and construction post design. o Upgrades to the aging slabs on taxiways, apron areas will also be the focus for the next two
